Afro Celt Sound System: "Release"

<u>Context:</u>	The song 'Release' is <u>a tribute to Jonas Bruce</u> , one of the keyboard players, who died suddenly. Famous singer <u>Sinead O'Connor stepped in and wrote the lyrics for this song</u> . The lyrics imagine Jonas telling the band he is still with them in spirit and they should be happy for him. <i>" Don't argue amongst yourselves because of the loss of me,</i> <i>I'm sitting amongst yourselves, don't think you can't see me.</i> <i>I haven't gone anywhere, but out of my body"</i> 'Volume 2: Release' debuted in <u>1999.</u>
<u>Dynamics</u>	Linked to texture: <u>Gets louder when more instruments</u> eg. Verses/ solos <u>Gets quieter when less instruments</u> eg. Break/ outro Dynamics = Linked to technology As made of 'loops' & synthesised sounds, <u>no dynamic markings</u> Editing techniques used to make some parts louder than other / more 'prominent in the mix'
<u>Rhythm:</u>	Rhythm uses <u>straight rhythms</u> and <u>syncopated rhythms</u> , also use of <u>semiquavers</u> and <u>occasional triplets, polyrhythms, slightly swung</u> Polyrhythm and cross rhythms
<u>Tempo:</u>	Tempo is <u>moderato – 100bpm</u>
<u>Metre:</u>	Metre is free time at the start and changes to 4/4 when bodhran enters
<u>Structure:</u>	Intro, Verse 1, Break, Verse 2, Solos, Verse 3, Breakdown, Outro
<u>Melody:</u>	 <u>Melody of vocals</u> – Vocables, parlando, Improvised, transcription Repetitive, syllabic, based on C Minor Pentatonic scale, moves mainly in steps 3 x 8 bar phrases Female vocal (English), Male vocal (African/Maninka), Male Vocal (Gaelic) Range of female vocal – 6^{th,} Range of male vocal – 10th <u>Melody of Solos</u> - Slides, glissando, idiomatic (suited to the instrument) Repetitive, based on 2 bar phrases, uses steps and leaps, wide pitch range Based on C Minor pentatonic scale (5 note scale) Mainly diatonic
	Drones used, using C and G notes Modal – Aeolian and Dorian modes

Instrumentation and Sonority:

African – Kora, Talking Drum, Djembe Gaelic – Accordion, Uilleann pipes, Hurdy-Gurdy, Low Whistle, Bodhran, Fiddle Western/Electronic – Synthesiser, Drum Machine, Electric piano, male and female vocals, shaker and tambourine <u>Live instruments</u>: Male and Female vocals, soloists (hurdy-gurdy, low whistle, uilleann pipes

Texture:PREDOMINANTLY homophony
Monophony (intro) & heterophony (outro) used RARELY
Layers up & down depending on how many loops used/ instruments
Amount of layers varies between sections
Layered textures
Verse 3 - Polyphony

- **Harmony**: Uses loops, ostinatos, block chords, arpeggiated chords, drone, pedal note, static harmony, double stopping
- Tonality:The key is based around <u>C Minor</u> (3 flats Bb, Eb, Ab), but is mainly modal
Melody is based around <u>C Minor Pentatonic scale</u> (C Eb F G Bb),
Modal uses C Dorian and C Aeolian modes
C Dorian begins on 2nd note of scale
(original scale Bb Major C D Eb F G A Bb C)
C Aeolian begins on 6th note of scale
(original scale Eb Major C D Eb F G Ab Bb C)

Technology:Drum machine28 loops which are layered and mixed for live performers to improvise over
the topSynth sounds – Bass, bells, strings, soft pad (chords)Multi-track recordingMixingPanningFilter SweepReverbDelaySamples
