


 <p>Section 1: Thinking Skills</p>	<p>Generic problem-solving skills, and critical thinking skills, including the ability to understand and reason through an argument.</p>	<p>32 multiple-choice questions</p>	<p>60 minutes (112 seconds per question)</p>
 <p>Section 2: Scientific Knowledge</p>	<p>Applying scientific knowledge typically covered in school to unfamiliar situations.</p>	<p>27 multiple-choice questions</p>	<p>30 minutes (66 seconds per question)</p>
 <p>Section 3: Essay Writing/ Three Paragraphs</p>	<p>Selecting, developing, and organising ideas, and communicating them in a concise and effective way. No outside knowledge required.</p>	<p>Complete one writing task from a choice of three questions</p>	<p>30 minutes</p>

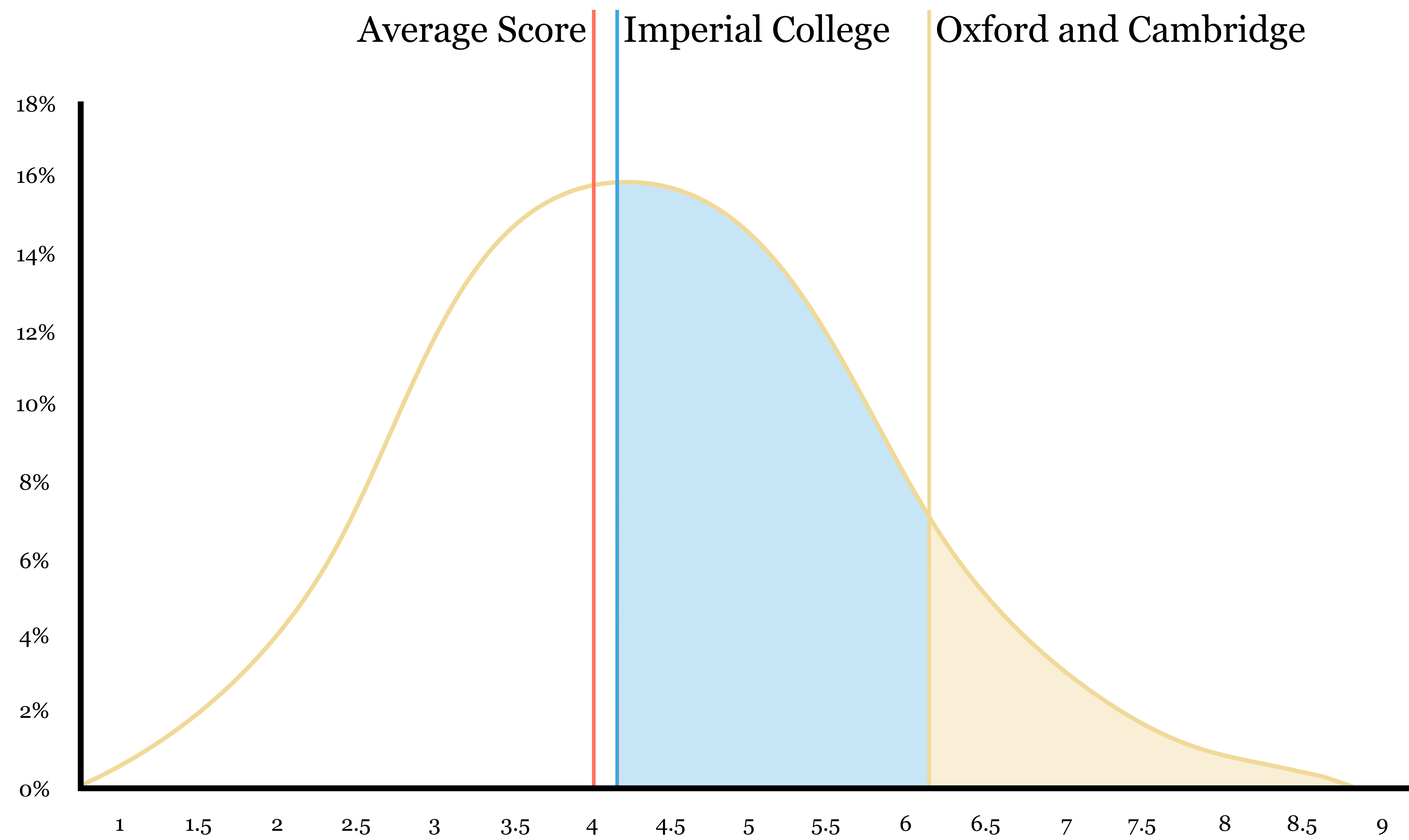

Minimum Target Score by Institution

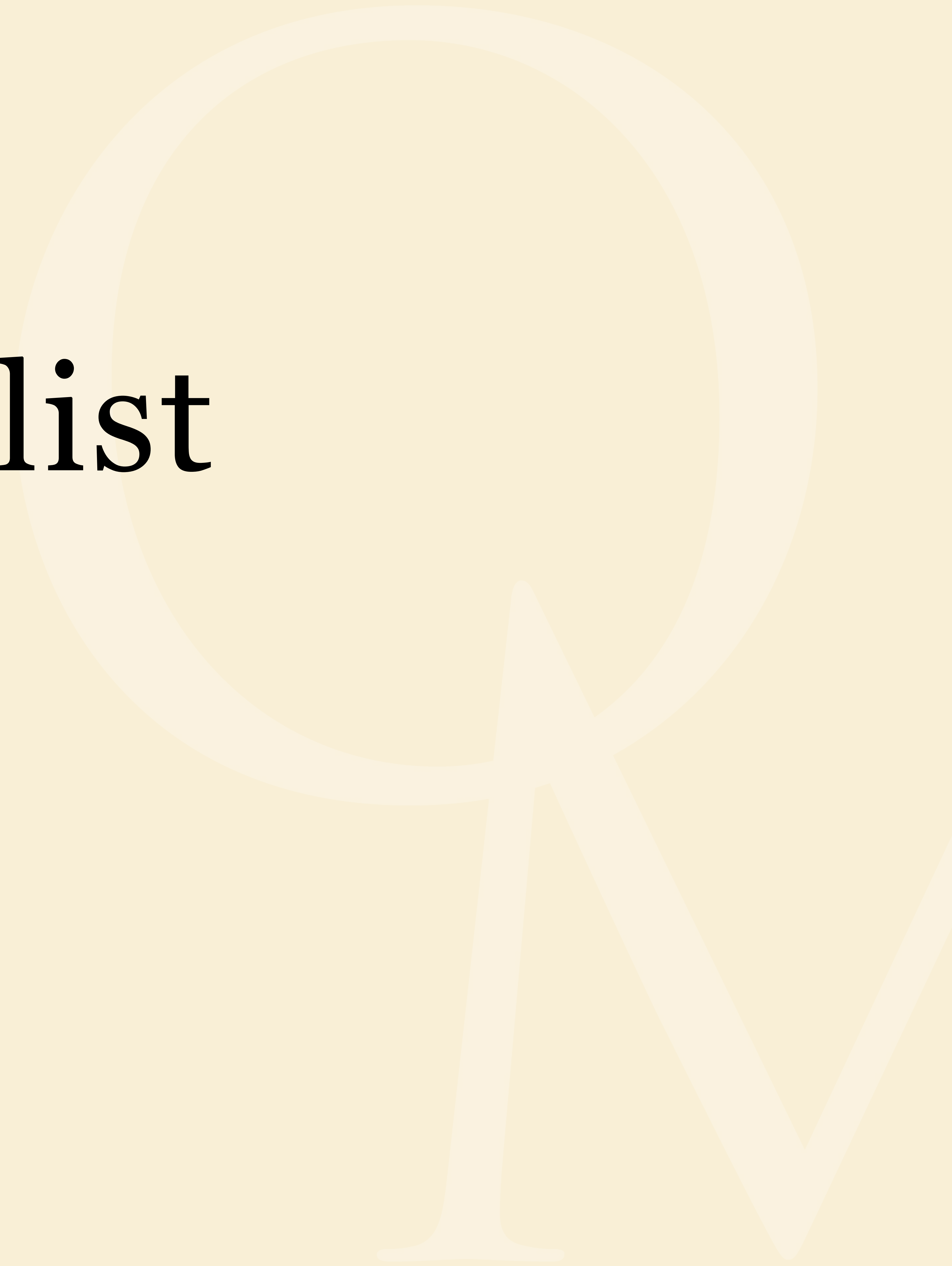

- Have you achieved a BMAT score of at least 6 if you're applying to Oxbridge, or 5 if not?

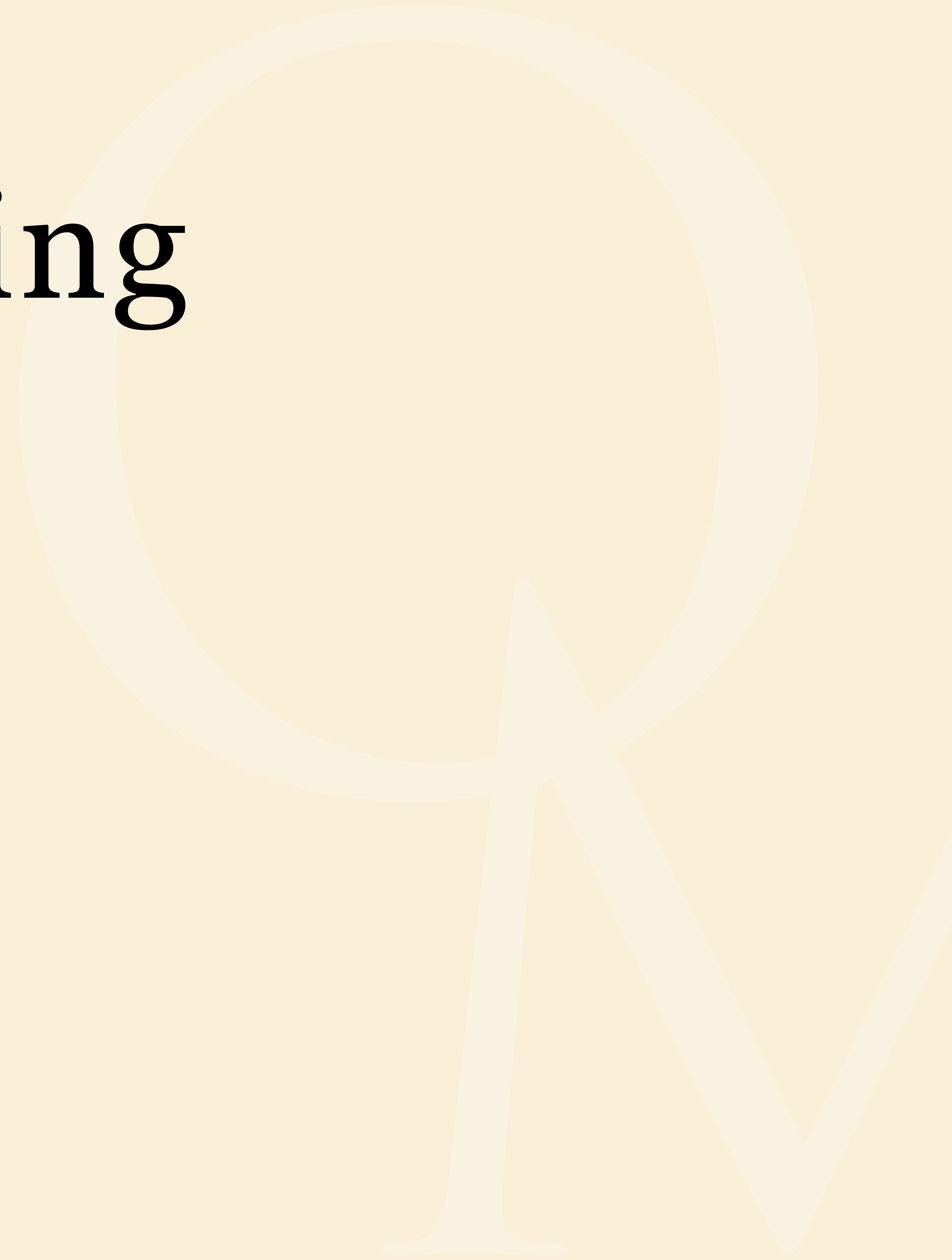
Section 1: Thinking Skills

- Be confident with fractions: conversions from decimals, addition, subtraction, multiplication, and simplification
- Be confident with your times tables up to 12

Section 2: Scientific Knowledge

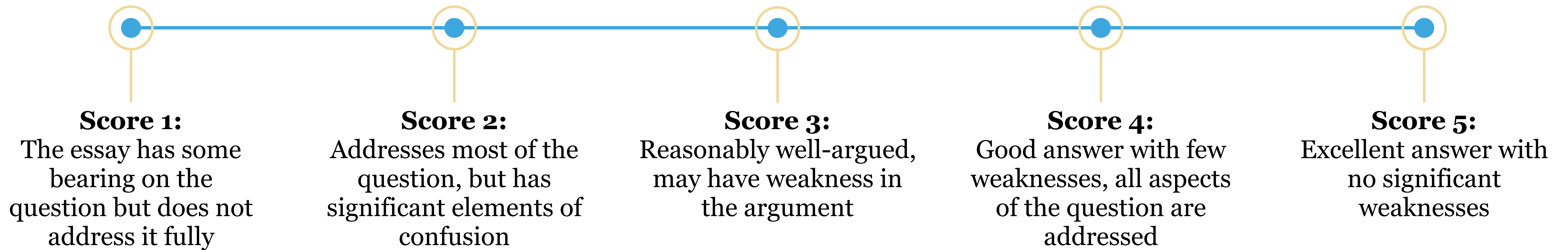
- Be confident with all the top priority topics per subject:
 - **Biology:** Human biology; Carbon & Nitrogen cycle
 - **Chemistry:** mole calculations
 - **Physics:** electricity; energy & force; the atom & radioactivity; waves
- Move onto revising all the outstanding topics highlighted in the Official 'Assumed Knowledge Guide'
